

Billboard project: hope and help for abortion-minded moms

One out of three people affected. One out of three women, one out of three men, one out of three babies never to live to full term. The statistics are overwhelming, both in terms of the children that are missing from our parishes, communities, schools and lives, but also in the grieving parents, the majority who eventually will face the reality that, in their moment of desperation, the distorted language of modern culture allowed dehumanizing terms and lack of informed consent to open a portal into the death of their child.

An abortuary is a desperate mother's last stop, her last chance. Pope Saint John Paul II has challenged us that, "The only honest stance...is that of *radical solidarity with the woman*. It is not right to leave her alone. The experiences of many counseling centers show that the woman does not want to suppress the life of the child she carries within her. If she is supported in this attitude, and if at the same time she is freed from the intimidation of those around her, then she is even capable of heroism. "* We at Clark County Right to Life, along with our parishes, youth groups, and families, look hopefully to the future of our youth to create in them a solid platform that allows them to understand that the culture of life embraces God's will upon relationships: solid relationships with parents, siblings, and grandparents, and chaste and abstinent relationships with friends. Inspired to reach our youth, Clark County Right to Life is campaigning to place billboards close to every high school and college campus that reinforces this message of life. As this demographic is most likely to be in crisis pregnancy, we would like to inspire our youth to choose chastity and abstinence, and to create a lifeline for those who are pregnant and in despair. We pray that a daily reminder to and from school allows the Holy Spirit to reinforce the message that God's plan is for intimacy and marriage to be intertwined, and that there is hope and mercy for all.

40 Days for Life: A story of healing after abortion

It was a quiet Friday afternoon and there were just two of us standing on the sidewalk across the street from the Vancouver Planned Parenthood Abortion Center. A lady stopped her car in front of us. We walked over to her. She told us she had an abortion over 20 years ago. "It was the best thing for everyone." Her family life was not supportive and her boyfriend didn't want a baby. "I grieve for your loss," was our response. "No one has ever said that to me before," she said. We told her that many women who have abortions see no
